Department of Health and Social Care - Independent investigation of NHS performance: terms of reference	The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Wes Streeting, has commissioned an immediate and independent investigation of the NHS across England. Kingdom</th><td>This report contains the results of the first investigation into the nation's resilience and preparedness for the Covid-19 pandemic. Department of Health and Social Care - Review of suicides and gender dysphoria at the Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust: independent report	This is a review of data provided by NHS England (NHSE) on suicides by young patients of the gender services at the Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust, based on an audit at the trust. The specific aim of the review (undertaken by Professor Louis Appleby) was to examine evidence for a large rise in suicides claimed by campaigners. Department of Health and Social Care - Review into the operational effectiveness of the Care Quality Commission: interim report	In May 2024, Dr Penny Dash was asked to conduct a review into the operational effectiveness of the CQC. The purpose of the review was to examine the suitability of the CQC's new single assessment framework methodology for inspections and ratings of health and care providers. This interim report provides a high-level summary of the emerging findings of the review in order to inform the changes needed to start the process of improving the CQC.
